


DIRECTIONS

Small and medium sized businesses are critical to the economic well being of any region. The start-ups - the fountains of innovation and creativity - are generally small companies. Small and mid-sized companies are involved in the manufacturing of high-tech goods and components. They generally have one manufacturing facility, and cannot transfer operations to another location in the event of a major disaster. Their survival and well being, after a major disaster, are critical to the health of our region.

Previous disasters have resulted in smaller companies being far more adversely affected than larger companies, and in some cases with worldwide consequences.
